

Changing the FM reception mode

When a broadcast is in stereo, "ST." lights up and you can hear stereo effects. However, if an FM stereo broadcast is hard to receive or noisy, you can select monaural (MONO) mode. Reception improves, but you lose the stereo effect

To select the monaural mode "MONO" appears.
